Silent Soldier



Proposed for installation to the right of the Memorial Plaque at Bonvilston.

Made from 10mm laser cut plate steel which is then hot dipped galvanized for weather and corrosion protection and wet painted in a 2 pack acrylic paint system in colour of choice. Anchor fixed for stability and against unauthorised removal, virtually vandal proof, maintenance free and with a 25 year guarantee.

A 1800mm high Single Soldier with underground anchor, galvanised and painted is priced at £640.00 + VAT

Memorial Paving



It is proposed to pave around the Memorial with dark grey limestone pavers 600x300mm and edged to keep them in place.



To the front will be two small raised planters built from stone with limestone coping that can be covered with decorative aggregate and/or planted with evergreens or seasonal plants.

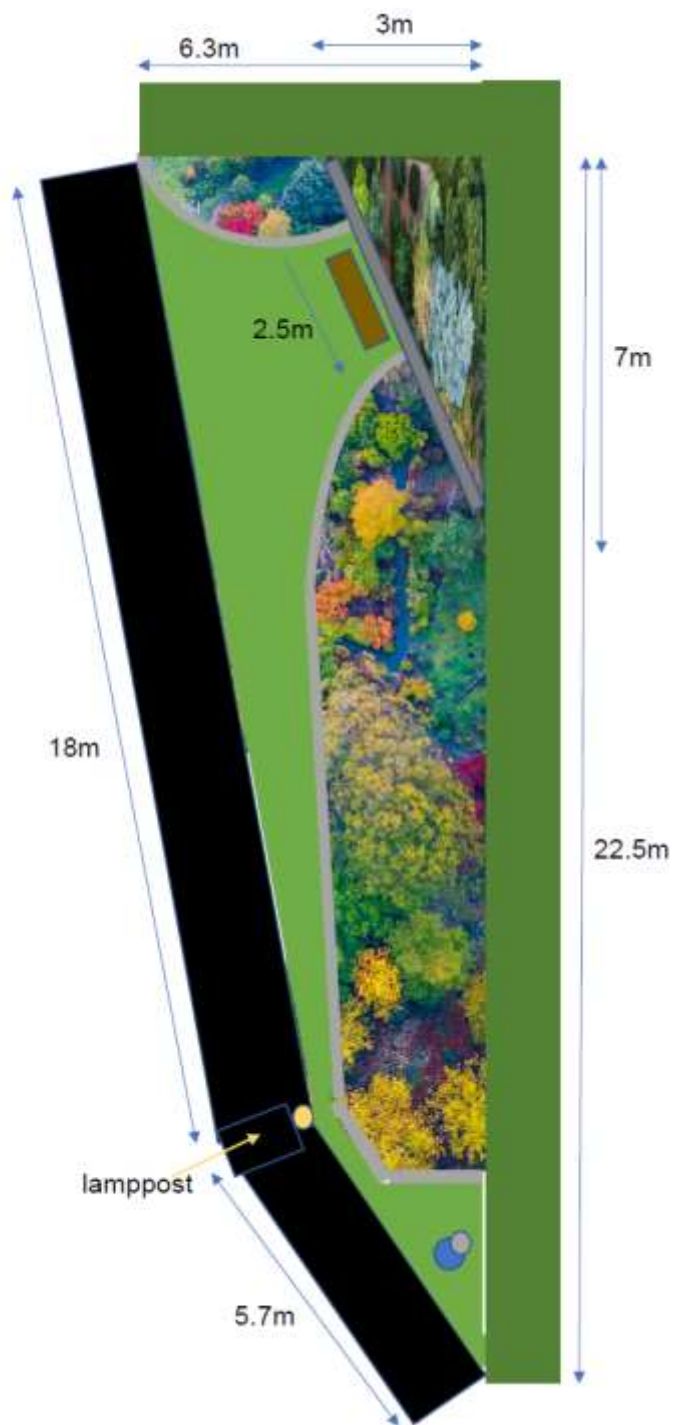
Coping example:
