1. Chair's welcome and introductions

The Chair confirmed quorum and welcomed all to the meeting.

- Road noise pollution at Cottrell Gardens Bonvilston was raised.
- The use of the Copthorne Hotel by Cardiff City Council to temporarily house homeless families until at least March 2024 was then discussed. The Home Office ended its use of the hotel for evacuees from Kabul and Cardiff Council saw an opportunity to centralise its temporary accommodation for the rising number of homeless families from Cardiff. The centralised location will enable the council to provide better support. Children will continue to attend the same schools

16. To consider

a. Employment of a Support and Training Officer It was resolved to employ and extra officer on a short-term basic through the Local Government Resource Centre (LGRC) Proposed Cllr Perry, seconded Cllr Sexton

b. Boundary Commission 'Community Ward' boundary review proposals It was resolved to respond to the consultation on the proposals by the Boundary Commission for new Community Ward boundaries. It was felt that



the retail parks at Culverhouse Cross, the new development at the site of the former HTV studios and Twyn yr Odyn (allotments and playing field owned by Wenvoe Community Council) should be part of the new Brooklands Ward. Properties at the top of Lon Haelfaes should be moved from St Georges into the St Nicholas Community Ward. The Council was happy with the proposed changes for the Bonvilston Community Ward.

c. Vale of Glamorgan Council Cabinets decision on Default 20mph speed limit exemption at St Nicholas

There is disappointment with the decision of the Vale Council to exempt Cowbridge Road at St Nicholas from the 20mph default speed limit. The cost of Judicial Review is prohibitive. The council will continue to advocate for improved compliance with the speed limit and action to reduce the level of road noise pollution.

d. Locations of Christmas Trees

It was resolved to install an additional tree at Trehill, by Old Rectory Drive, with other trees being installed as in 2022 at Maes y Ffynnon, Cottrell Gardens, School Lane, St Nicholas green, Cae Newydd and Duffryn Lane – except those trees that were in planters will now go into the ground. Proposed Cllr Sexton, seconded Cllr Glasson

e. Picnic bench for St Nicholas village green

It was resolved to have a picnic bench installed on the Village Green at St Nicholas, funded by S106 money from the new housing developments. Proposed Cllr Harris and seconded Cllr Glasson
